SUPPLIER SCREENING, ASSESSMENT, SUPPORT AND CAPACITY BUILDING

SCREENING

Our Company takes a systematic approach to supplier selection to determine which suppliers should we evaluate on environmental, social, governance and business-relevant aspects.

100% of our Tier-1 suppliers are screened for compliance related risks.

ASSESSMENT

The level of Assessment is determined based on the criticality of the agreements signed, considering their value, place of execution, the nature of the services, and risks related to occupational health & safety and validity.

When medium or high criticality is determined, the crosscutting areas of the Company (Health & Safety, Environmental, Labor, Administrative, Human Rights and Social), together with the contract administrator, periodically evaluate performance and, if required, we inform the supplier about the opportunities for improvement.

Our annual target is to assess 100% of our significant suppliers.

SUPPORT

We monitor and report on the coverage and progress of our supplier evaluation and development program, and on the progress of suppliers who have corrective action plans in place.

CAPACITY BUILDING

In partnership with the Oil, Gas and Energy Goods and Services Chamber (Campetrol), we trained 70 suppliers in human rights in 2024.

We also took part in a pilot plan led by Guías Colombia and in coordination with other companies in our sector, to train our suppliers about respecting human rights. We trained representatives of more than 50 local companies in:

- Creating human rights policies for their companies
- Identifying key stakeholders in human rights management
- Creating a matrix for the identification of actual and potential impacts on human rights among their stakeholders
